

SELECTION CRITERIA

LECTURER / SENIOR LECTURER / ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR IN ENVIRONMENTAL LAW

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA

- Hold, or have made significant progress towards obtaining, a postgraduate law degree, demonstrating specialist knowledge in Environmental Law;
- Have a proven track record of original legal research in Environmental Law, demonstrated by publication in refereed academic journals and leading Environmental Law texts;
- Be capable of effective teaching in Environmental Law at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels; and
- Demonstrated talent and enthusiasm for teaching one of the compulsory law subjects in the LLB and JD programs, such as torts, contracts, and administrative/public law
- Have an interest in and ability to contribute to the activities of the Australian Centre for Climate and Environmental Law.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA (LEVEL B / LECTURER)

- Capacity to undertake independent teaching and research in staff member's discipline or related area
- Ability to make an independent contribution to research, scholarship and/or teaching through professional practice and expertise, and coordinate and/or lead the activities of other staff, as appropriate to the discipline
- Capacity to contribute to teaching at undergraduate, honours and postgraduate level
- Ability to undertake full academic responsibilities related to the administration and coordination of an award program of the University provided that this is consistent with a reasonable overall workload
- Ability to contribute to Faculty administration, by committee membership.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA (LEVEL C / SENIOR LECTURER)

- Proven ability to make a significant contribution to the discipline at national level
- In research, scholarship and/or teaching, proven capacity to make original contributions which expand knowledge or practice in discipline
- Capacity and willingness to make a significant contribution to administration activities of an organisational unit or interdisciplinary area at undergraduate, honours and postgraduate level
- Ability to play a major role or provide a significant degree of leadership in scholarly, research and/or professional activities relevant to the profession, discipline and/or community
- Ability and willingness to perform full academic responsibilities of, and related administration for, coordination of a large award program or a number of smaller award programs, if consistent with a reasonable overall workload.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA (LEVEL D / ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR)

- Demonstrated capacity to make an outstanding contribution to research, scholarship and/or teaching and administration activities of an organisational unit, including a large organisational unit, or interdisciplinary area
- Ability to teach in high level specialist postgraduate units of study
- Ability and willingness to co-ordinate a large award program or a number of smaller award programs where this is consistent with a reasonable overall workload
- Capacity to make an outstanding contribution to governance and collegial life inside and outside the University
- Will have attained recognition at a national or international level in staff member's discipline and is expected to make original and innovative contributions to advancement of scholarship, research and teaching in discipline.
- Capacity to supervise research students at PhD, SJD and Masters level.
