What do dancers think about when they move and which mental imagery strategies do they apply effectively when working creatively?

Two funded PhD studentships in dance psychology are available from 1 September 2014 forming part of a 3 year research project funded by The Leverhulme Trust *In the Dancer's Mind: Creativity, Novelty and Imagination*.

The Project:

The project will explore the way that dance students develop strategies for using mental imagery over the course of their education and training. Intervention material will be created to enhance this development and evaluate its effectiveness.

The project will extend the work of the interdisciplinary team whose collaboration has been facilitated by Dr. Scott deLahunta of R-Research, the scientific research arm of Wayne McGregor | Random Dance and as part of the partnership between Wayne McGregor | Random Dance, Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance and Coventry University.

The Principal Investigator, Professor Jon May, is Professor in Cognitive Psychology at Plymouth University, and his research focuses on mental imagery. The Coinvestigators are Dr. Emma Redding, Head of Dance Science at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance and Professor Sarah Whatley, Director of the Centre for Dance Research at Coventry University.

The PhD studentships provide a unique opportunity to study a highly select population over a period of time. Moreover, it is an opportunity for two high-calibre students to become involved in a dance science creativity study.

The project will address questions around the role of mental imagery within the creative process of making dance through a longitudinal study of dance students at two leading centres for dance training (Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance and Coventry University Performing Arts Department), with the collaboration of a third (Plymouth University School of Humanities and Performing Arts).

One of the successful applicants will be based at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance, London, UK, under the supervision of Dr Emma Redding. He/she will be joining the Trinity Laban Research Degree Programme and Graduate School, a community of staff, taught postgraduates and postgraduate research students: composers, performers and choreographers as well as music and dance science researchers. Research degrees at Trinity Laban are validated by City University. The other successful applicant will be based at Coventry University under the supervision of Professor Sarah Whatley. Entry Requirements:

Applicants should be qualified to master's level in areas such as dance science, psychology or related discipline; they should be able to show evidence of and interest in dance making and the creative process. Appropriate training and opportunities for personal development will be provided in areas with which the successful applicants are not currently expert.

This three-year studentship, funded by The Leverhulme Trust is for fees plus an annual tax-free stipend of £13,726.

PURPOSE OF THE POST

The primary function of the role is to work on the research project, 'In the Dancer's Mind: Creativity, Novelty, Imagination'

The successful applicant will be based within the Faculty of Dance at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance and will undertake research associated with six work packages. These will include the development of novel measures of the multimodal imagery used in movement generation tasks by establishing relationships with dance students and their tutors. Cross-sectional studies will also be conducted to validate the instruments and test hypotheses about the nature of creativity, particularly the way that instructions influence imagery strategies. Longitudinal studies will be conducted to assess changes in the use of mental imagery as students gain experience and progress through their training.

A part of the data collected will form the basis of the student's doctoral thesis, underpinned by his or her own independent scholarship. The thesis must be completed and submitted by 31 August 2017.

- To work in partnership with the project team to help refine the larger research project and develop specific research objectives for PhD research
- To conduct comprehensive literature reviews around the topic of enquiry and the larger remit of the project and to regularly liaise with internal and external colleagues to organise data collections
- To write research ethics applications and adhere to ethical principles of conducting research with human participants

- To maintain comprehensive data records and undertake other general administrative duties
- To undertake quantitative and qualitative assessments such as questionnaires, interviews and observations and to undertake corresponding data analysis using statistical software and other IT programmes where relevant
- To assist in the periodical dissemination of findings in the form of presentations, workshops and papers
- To plan, organise and undertake a complex research project across institutions working with a large project team
