Position Summary

The Senior Lecturer, Photography will contribute to teaching, research and program development of the School, within the Photography discipline area, particularly in the delivery of Photography studios which require leadership from an experienced industry professional who will also integrate his/her sound knowledge of contemporary visual cultural theory as it relates to photographic practice. They should also have a sound knowledge of production and post-production skills, and a background as a creative practice researcher/practitioner.

The Senior Lecturer will contribute to the development and delivery of innovative and flexible teaching programs at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels, as well as making a significant contribution to research, and/or consulting activities. The Senior Lecturer is expected to actively promote the Photography discipline and associated programs by establishing and maintaining memberships, links and partnerships with academic, industry and professional communities.

The Senior Lecturer will be experienced in the provision of innovative and effective leadership in a tertiary education setting and will demonstrate the ability to work collaboratively and collegially in playing a leadership role in the undergraduate Photography program and postgraduate supervision, as well as in the development of a learning and teaching culture of practice within the School.

The Senior Lecturer will develop, engage in and lead high quality research projects that are aligned with the University's research focus areas to achieve success in attracting research funding and to produce high quality outputs. The Senior Lecturer is expected to take on academic administration at a senior level, including roles such as Program Manager, and to undertake active membership of School and College committees.

Organisational Accountabilities

2. Course Development. Ensure the quality, currency and relevance of undergraduate Photography courses are maintained through processes of regular evaluation and review, course development, and student-centred orientation in design and implementation.

3. Supervision. Supervision of undergraduate and postgraduate research projects and theses and development of students' understanding of analytical and creative approaches that explore the practical application of theoretical knowledge.
4. Research. Contribute and provide leadership in the building of the research profile of Photography through maintaining an active individual research and publication profile, and providing leadership in the development of a research culture in Photography through development of new research initiatives, submission of applications for competitive research funding, presentation of papers at conferences and publication of papers in learned journals.
5. Administration. Work with the Program Manager to ensure effective administration of the program area and that relevant targets in terms of profile and budget development are met. The Senior Lecturer will be available to take on the Program Manager role in rotation with other senior staff in the discipline field.
6. Industry Relations. Represent the discipline area in the academic, professional and wider communities and maintain close interaction with industry and professional bodies, locally and internationally, to ensure that research and learning and teaching activities undertaken place the program/discipline as a recognised leader in the field.
7. University. Contribute to the strategic direction setting and policy making processes of the University, College and School by participating in key forums and committees and undertaking specific College level projects/tasks as required.
8. Undertake other duties as directed by the Deputy Dean and/or Dean of School.

Key Selection Criteria

1. Demonstrated capacity, commitment and strategies for developing high quality and innovative learning and teaching in undergraduate and postgraduate Photography education, including evidence of good teaching practice and the ability to work effectively and negotiate sensitively with students on issues related to effective learning.
2. Demonstrated capacity to develop innovative Photography curriculum and educational programs, and a capacity to work across disciplines and in flexible delivery modes, including online.
3. Research and/or professional experience in the current global contexts of the Photographic industry, at a local, national and international level, evidence of strong theoretical and conceptual knowledge of the discipline as well as a sound proficiency in digital production and post production and a background as a creative practice researcher/practitioner and/or studio based practitioner.
4. Demonstrated capacity to supervise and offer consultation to students and others conducting projects at Honours and postgraduate levels.
5. Demonstrated record of scholarship and refereed research publications in the area of Photography, including a track record of research leadership and success in obtaining research funding.
6. Demonstrated capacity to fulfil the requirements of course administration and to work in a harmonious, sensitive, cooperative and effective manner with other teaching and administrative staff.
7. Contributions to wider School, College/Faculty and University strategic imperatives.
8. Demonstrated capacity to internationalise undergraduate and postgraduate Photography education.

Qualifications

Mandatory: PhD or equivalent in a relevant discipline.

Preferred: Completion of the Essentials in Tertiary Teaching Practice program or equivalent¹ (if the appointed candidate does not meet this requirement at time of appointment, they will be supported to complete this as a requirement to fulfil their probation).
