JOB SPECIFICATION

The UCL Institute of Archaeology is recognised as one of the leading academic departments of Archaeology not just in the UK but globally. The Institute is the largest department in its field in the UK, with the largest graduate research community, and the broadest range of coverage, and offers a uniquely stimulating environment for the study of all fields of archaeology, conservation and cultural heritage. With more than 60 research-active staff pursuing high-quality research across five continents, the Institute is at the forefront of global archaeology, conservation and heritage.

We are seeking to appoint a research-active Lecturer to contribute to research and teaching in the archaeology of the Mediterranean. The archaeology of the Mediterranean is a very lively field of research and teaching at UCL, driven by expertise in the prehistory and early historic archaeology of the Middle East, the prehistoric Aegean, 4th-2nd millennium Egypt, the 1st-millennium BC Central Mediterranean and Greek and Roman Art. The strength of the field at the UCL Institute of Archaeology comes from cross-regional, comparative perspectives and truly interdisciplinary approaches to the field grounded in the diverse research approaches pursued at the Institute from conservation and archaeological sciences to heritage and museum studies, and through cross-institutional collaborations.

We are seeking to appoint a candidate whose specialist field will complement and diversify, either in regional focus or time period or both, our existing areas of strength and take an active role in comparative research and teaching in the archaeology of the Mediterranean basin. The successful candidate will bring their own area of expertise to the Institute, and have a vision for cross-regional, comparative and interdisciplinary approaches to the field; they will also have the ambition to research broader questions beyond the boundaries of their own area of expertise. The post-holder will be expected to undertake research of the highest quality within their own specialism contributing to the research standing and culture of the Institute. They will also be engaged in or develop active field research in the Mediterranean.

The post-holder will teach at all levels, from undergraduate and postgraduate to research degree level in their own area of expertise and will contribute to the teaching at all levels beyond their own area of expertise, especially as part of the MA

in Mediterranean Archaeology, and ideally, be able to contribute to the teaching of heritage and heritage-related courses. The post-holder will contribute to administrative duties related to teaching and the running of the Institute.

The appointment is for a full-time permanent position, which is available from 1 September 2015.

UCL's high expectations of its academic staff are set out in the document 'Excellence and the UCL Community' (http://www.ucl.ac.uk/excellence/) under the headings of Research, Teaching, Enabling and Knowledge Transfer.

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- To develop internationally significant research in one's own area of expertise within the archaeology of the Mediterranean.
- To assist in the coordination of the MA in Mediterranean Archaeology (including admissions and academic administration).
- To supervise Mediterranean archaeology related BA/BSc dissertations and MA/MSc dissertations.
- To recruit and supervise MPhil/PhD research students with Mediterranean archaeological topics.
- Be able to contribute to core first and second-year undergraduate teaching in Mediterranean regions.
- To coordinate and teach MA options in Mediterranean archaeology and contribute to Mediterranean Archaeology MA core courses.
- To contribute to Mediterranean archaeology related topics in undergraduate core courses.
- To make minor contributions to other courses.
- To provide pastoral care and tutorial support to students.
- To actively follow and promote UCL policies, including Equal Opportunities.
- To maintain an awareness and observation of fire and health and safety regulations.
- To carry out any other duties commensurate with the grade and purpose of the post, as requested by the Director of the Institute.
