ESSENTIAL MINIMUM CRITERIA

- 1 Registrable as a medical practitioner with the Australian Health Professional Regulation Agency.
- 2 Specialist recognition in Clinical Pharmacology.
- 3 Doctoral degree or equivalent.
- 4 Demonstrated commitment to undergraduate teaching in medicine, dentistry, nursing and health sciences, including participation in cross-disciplinary teaching.
- 5 A record of successful research activity, demonstrated by scholarly and quality publication, nationally competitive research funding, contract research funding and supervising higher degree students where relevant.
- 6 Demonstrated ability to provide academic and professional leadership in clinical pharmacology at team, discipline and institutional levels.
- 7 An understanding of national and international issues relevant to the development of Clinical Pharmacology as science and profession and demonstrated interest in QUM policy development and implementation.
- 8 Highly developed interpersonal and communication skills including the ability to collaborate across the University and to mentor staff.

DESIRABLE CHARACTERISTICS

- 1 An ability to pursue research aligned with at least one of the current Discipline research strengths of neuropharmacology and pharmacogenomics including capacity to conduct cross-disciplinary research at School and Faculty level, especially in the fields of the Neurosciences and, Aging and Chronic Diseases.
- 2 Demonstrated track record of high-quality teaching at undergraduate and postgraduate levels.
- 3 Demonstrated track record of course development and/or course coordination in medicine at undergraduate and postgraduate levels.
- 4 A strong commitment to collaborative research nationally and internationally.
